Winter Grade Weather Protection:

Whilst our winter grade tents are a little heavier than our 3 Season Hiking Tent range, they come with many benefits. Primarily these tents are distinguished by their full nylon inners that block out cold drafts and protect you from condensation drips from the fly and even from snow drifts. Their enhanced architecture and materials are designed to handle blustery wet weather providing you with reliable shelter. Interior ventilation is optimised in order to let out humid air and move moisture so your tent interior stays nice and dry. These tents with full nylon inners are versatile and comfortable and can be used year round. Winter tents are the perfect choice for remote wilderness alpine walks; Tasmania's South West in particular is known for unpredictable weather even in summer. Tent Care Tips

Protect your tent floor – It keeps you dry! Where possible carry a ground cloth to place under the tent tub floor, this additional item is lightweight and replaceable - unlike your tent. Some of our range come with footprints, for others consider purchasing a custom fit, lightweight footprint or ground sheet.

Take time to survey the ground for a flat surface to lay your tent on; removing sticks, stones and other sharp objects will protect your tent floor from damage – and provide you with a good nights sleep!

Do not keep food inside the tent – tasty treats can entice local wildlife to scratch and nibble their way through the walls of your valuable tent.

Shake debris out of the tent in between camp sites to prevent damage from abrasives.

Never store your tent damp; as soon as you return from your trip put up your tent and hang out the fly so that you can ensure both are absolutely dry before being packed away.

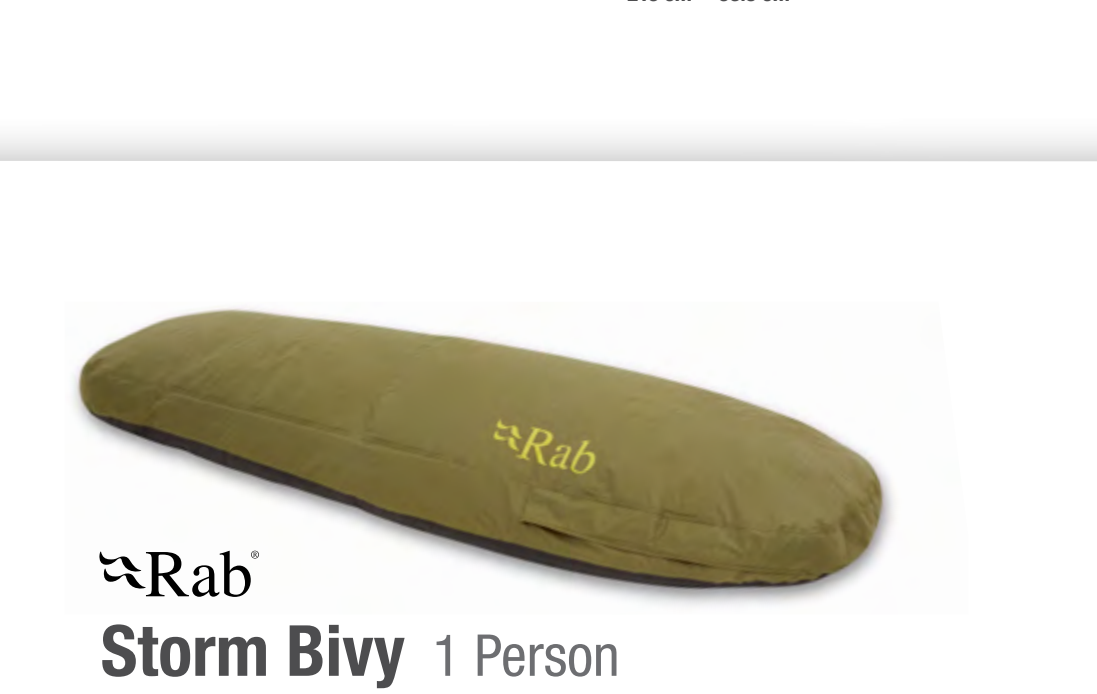

ALPINE BIVY'S



SOLO SHELTERS

The bivouac sack, or bivy as it is affectionately known, is a weatherproof cover for your sleeping bag. It is an ultralight, minimalist shelter for adventurers on fast and light missions, and an emergency shelter for backcountry expeditions.

Bivy's are great for those planning big pursuits where minimal weight, packability, and compact footprint size, are requisites for success.

Weekend explorers also value bivouacs for their hassle-free simplicity. They are easy to set up at night and pack down the next morning giving you more time on the trail. Furthermore, they offer an unparalleled sense of immersion in the environment. Your uninhibited view will elevate your impression of the grandeur of the mountains and the immediacy of the natural world.

When deciding whether a bivy is the right choice for your adventure, consider the impact of factors like condensation, bugs, the restrictive space, and the forecast. Once you know the type of adventure you wish to tackle and have considered your comfort balances you will easily be able to choose the right balance of features and performance that you need from your shelter.

Tips for bivy camping

Look for a protected site to set up camp. This will afford you some shelter from wind and the elements. Take care not to set up in a low-lying area where water is likely to pool.

Cinch the bivy's hood down around your face for shelter, but avoid breathing inside the bivy as this can cause condensation. Instead, consider packing a neck gaiter or balaclava as a lightweight face mask.

Ensure your pack has its own protection from damp conditions, use a backpack liner and maybe a rain cover too. Protect the gear you need to keep warm by storing it at the foot of your sleeping bag.

Protect your shelter and, cook a good distance away from your sleeping site. Check the forecast! And enjoy the lighter pack on your back.
